

### FUMC Centennial Moments for October: CHRISTMAS LIGHT MEMORIAL FUND

Several years ago, the United Methodist Women sought an additional fundraiser to add to their local mission work. The idea came of having lights put on the big oak tree on the front lawn. The first lights were bought 'on sale' after Christmas and, the following fall, the first "Annual Christmas Tree Lights" became a tradition. A ceremony was held under the tree with the Youth Choir, hot chocolate, and cookies!

Since then, many local charities have benefited from donations. This year, renamed "Christmas Light Memorial Fund", the proceeds will be given to Hope House which aids homeless Myrtle Beach High School students. UMW hopes to make this year's lights shine brighter than ever by asking our entire church membership to make a donation of at least \$20 "In Memory or In Honor of a Loved One".

### Consecration Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view Christian financial giving to their church merely as a way to pay its bills, but rather as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

The New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program will teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year. It is a program based on the biblical philosophy of the need to give for his or her own spiritual development rather than on the need of the church to receive. It encourages us in proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card

During morning worship, our guest speaker will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, culminated by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship. We encourage your participation in Consecration Sunday events and we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.
