

1 John 4:8: Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love.

Both positive and negative changes occur in the heart and mind as a person ages (as noted in the book, **Real Solutions for Caring for Your Elderly Parent)**. A grandparent who enjoys time with grandchildren is likely more available and less pressured by constraints and demands (positive). Older adults may be less concerned about appearance, or become bitter, stubborn and withdrawn (negative). Positive and negative neurological changes are common and may be debilitating. A caregiver (whether related or not) should pay attention to the first signs of personality changes (forgetfulness or recognition) and seek the help of a physician. Listening to and sharing old stories, photographs, or past memories is a good exercise. Understanding and unconditional love will go a long way in one's care. The caregiver must also take care of self as well in order to care for another.

THE CALLING OF THE FIRST TWO APOSTLES

Christ is beckoning the two fishermen and pointing toward the shore where they could become fishers of men. (Matthew 4:18) The two men, having left their boat, are walking out of the water toward Jesus. Jesus is robed in white, symbolic of innocence of soul, of purity and of holiness of life.

The fish is attributed to Peter and Andrew, being fishermen. The

fish was frequently used as a symbol for Christ; the 5 Greek letters forming the word fish are from the initial letters of the 5 words, "Jesus Christ Son of God Savior." Three is a significant number in the Bible—the number of completion, expressive of a beginning, a middle and an end. The number 3 suggests the Trinity and also the 3 days Christ spent in the tomb. Green is the color of vegetation and symbolizes the triumph of spring over winter, or life over death. To believe in Christ in the early centuries was dangerous. Therefore, Christians agreed on the fish as a sign to identify one another.
