HEALING THE SICK During Christ's short ministry on earth, we read of His great healing powers, not only spiritually and mentally, but physically as well. The passage in John 4:46-54 speaks to the story of a nobleman's son who was sick at Caperrnaum and the miracle Jesus performed. His words, "Thy son liveth," were far reaching, not only in distance, but also in the healing of the boy himself. The blind, the lame, the dumb, the

lepers—all crossed His path. The blind were made to see, the dumb could speak, withered hands and bodies were made whole. (John 5: 1-9, Matthew 8:1-4, Luke 5:18-25) "And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people." (Matthew 9:35)

The burning torch with the crutches signifies the witnessing of Christians through the ministry of healing. In Matthew 5:16, we read, "Even so, let your light shine before men; that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven."
