CONGRATULATIONS to First Church's own Jayne Cannon who will be inducted into the Myrtle Beach High School Athletics Hall of Fame on October 2, 2020. Jayne was an MBHS Seahawk from 1953-57, and she played Varsity Basketball all 4 years, holding many school and state records. Jayne graduated from Coker College in 1961 where she played every sport possible. After graduation, Jayne went to Georgia for one year and taught in the DeKalb County Schools. Upon returning to Myrtle Beach, she coached MBHS ladies basketball for 19 years. Jayne also played Short Stop for the Myrtle Beach Hurricanes, a local softball team, earning the State Championship title that year. Jayne is a dedicated, long-time FUMC member and taught the 3&4 year-olds Sunday School for 50 years. # Who's Your Neighbor?

Matthew 22:36-39: "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." That neighbor could also include an aging parent.

In the book **Real Solutions for Caring for Your Elderly Parent**, Grace Ketterman, MD, and Kathy King, PhD, introduce steps for the adult child to care for, and to be an advocate for, an aging parent. Important first steps in that care are reviewing their financial condition and maintaining a delicate balance in decision-making. Other areas might include guiding a parent to make sound decisions in their home life, social life, and physical and mental health. Children are taught by parents, and other adults, to learn how to care for themselves as they grow. As parents reach the senior years of life, these roles might be reversed as a parent's mental capacity and/or physical ability become strained. An adult child could bring a wealth of needed up-to-date knowledge, time, and attention as a care advocate in a parent's life.
