

CHRIST IN THE TEMPLE—Jesus, even as a boy of 12, is dressed here in white robe, symbolic of purity. The Holy Family lived in the village of Nazareth after returning from Egypt. When Jesus was 12 years old, His family took Him to Jerusalem for the Feast of the Passover. As the family was on the return journey, they found that the lad was not with them. Hurrying back to Jerusalem, they found Him in the temple, surrounded by the

doctors, or Jewish Rabbis, with whom He was in deep discussion (Luke 2:41). This scene is usually called "Christ Among the Doctors."

THE LAMP—The lamp, because of the light it sheds, is used as a symbol of wisdom and piety.
